“It’s about connecting with everyone that you see every day. For me when I got my cochlear implant, I finally realised what I had been missing out on,” said Roisin, who was first fitted with hearing aids at four years old, and recently got a cochlear implant on her left side.

Hearing difficulties are a reality for 3.6 million Australians impacted by hearing loss<sup>1</sup> – which is set to double by 2060. There is also over 300 babies who are born with hearing loss each year<sup>2</sup>.

“When you stop and think about how many times a day you interact with sounds, it pretty much encompasses your entire life. Whether it be a simple conversation, watching TV or taking a phone call, it’s such a huge part of our day-to-day,” Roisin said.
